#### 1. Preamble

This Collaboration Agreement is intended to enable and guide the Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government to continue to promote effective local government through the collective research, analysis, planning, development and sharing of information related to municipal issues of mutual interest and importance.

This Collaboration Agreement replaces and builds upon all previous agreements that established, formalized or otherwise dealt with the Intergovernmental Committee on Urban and Regional Research (ICURR) including the foundational Memorandum of Agreement made in March, 1977. It is also recognized that members that were not signatory to the 1977 Agreement, including Nunavut, are now an important voice at the Table of Ministers responsible for local government. In addition, the original agreement pre-dates Yukon's 2003 name change.

Local governments in Canada deliver a broad spectrum of services including economic development, land-use planning, recreation, water and waste management, tourism, protective services and more. As such, they play an important role in every province and territory. There is a need to continue intergovernmental collaboration by promoting a constructive dialogue between provincial and territorial governments, and with relevant partners and organizations as well with the federal government, to increase effective oversight and provide support to local government sustainability.

The Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government is a strategic organization that will be flexible and representative of all thirteen provincial and territorial ministers; will be able to identify emerging trends and where appropriate and consistent with individual jurisdictions' determination, and will act collaboratively as a common forum for the success of local governments. The Table recognizes the principle of consensus based decision-making where the goal is that members ultimately come to a general agreement regarding the outcome.

The Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government is supported primarily by The Provincial and Territorial Officials Committee (PTOC) on Local Government which is the result of the merger of two organizations in 2011: The ICURR, created in 1967, and the Caucus of Senior Policy Officials (C-SPO).

### 2. Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government

2.1 The Ministers of the provinces and territories hereby confirm the Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government, whose common objectives, principles, mandate, operations and organization are described in this Agreement.

## 4. Objectives

- 4.1 The Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government exists to consider present and future challenges and opportunities facing local governments in order to develop common approaches and promote best practices to better meet the needs of local governments locally, regionally and nationally. This will be achieved by:
  - Strengthening interprovincial-territorial cooperation through collaboration and discussion of issues related to the effectiveness of local government.
  - Demonstrating collective leadership on pan-Canadian issues of interest related to local government.
  - Facilitating open dialogue in federal-provincial-territorial relations.

### 5. Mandate

In pursuit of these objectives, this organization will:

- 5.1 Serve as the forum where members can share and exchange viewpoints, information, knowledge and experiences.
- 5.2 Provide an integrated and coordinated approach and vision to provincial and territorial relations through the development of shared common analysis and positions, where possible and appropriate.
- 5.3 Maintain an open dialogue with the federal government in areas of mutual interest related to local government.
- 5.4 Address issues of mutual interest or priority which, in the opinion of the members, could benefit from the pooling of expertise, a greater dialogue between members and/or related partners and approved coordination of action.

### Representation

- 6.1 The members shall be represented at the Table by their minister responsible for Local Government. Should the situation arise, a minister may designate an alternate as a substitute representative for a meeting of the Table.
- 6.2 Notwithstanding the foregoing or prior agreement, no meeting of the table can take place if the majority of the members are not represented by their respective minister or someone designated by the minister to attend on their behalf.

### 7. Chair

6.

- 7.1 Provincial and territorial ministers shall take turns chairing this table according to the rotation established for the Annual Meeting of Ministers Responsible for Local Government.
- 7.2 The term of the Chair is one year, starting at the closing of the annual meeting and continuing until the closing of the following annual meeting he or she is

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### 11. Provincial Territorial Officials Committee (PTOC) on Local Government

- 11.1 The Table of Deputy Ministers is supported by the Provincial Territorial Officials Committee (the Committee).
- 11.2 Deputy Ministers of each province and territory will designate officials to participate in the Committee.
- 11.3 This Committee will be chaired by an official of the jurisdiction chairing the Table of Ministers responsible for Local Government.
- 11.4 This Committee will meet quarterly or as required to work on actions determined by the Table of Deputy Ministers.
- 11.5 This Committee shall prepare the meetings of the tables of deputy ministers and ministers, including the agenda and carry out the study, research and analysis of the priorities determined by the Table of Deputy Ministers Table.
- 11.6 This Committee will set its own terms of reference and prepare and provide a strategic plan to support its objectives and ultimately those of the Tables of Ministers and Deputy Ministers.
- 11.7 The Committee will approve the budget, audited financial statements and the annual report of the Secretariat.

### 12. Secretariat

- 12.1 The Secretariat replaces the Intergovernmental Committee on Urban and Regional Research (ICURR) and retains its assets.
- 12.2 The head of the Secretariat is hired by the Committee and reports to the Committee which is also the Secretariat's Board of Directors.
- 12.3 The mandate of the Secretariat is:
  - To provide support and coordination for the Annual Meeting of Ministers responsible for Local Government and to lead collective Provincial-Territorial actions through the Table of Deputy Ministers, the Committee and working groups;
  - To provide research support for the development of legislation, policy and programs in provinces and territories and the business thereof by undertaking custom and collective research on all spheres of interest to provincial and territorial ministers responsible for Local Government;



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- To support the collaborative discussion of the Tables of Ministers and Deputy Ministers as well as the Committee;
- To operate a library and information service with the most comprehensive municipal affairs collection in Canada for utilization by all members;
- To perform any task that the Committee assigns it and conduct the facilitation, research, analysis and carry out recommendations of the Committee; and
- To implement the objectives set forth in its strategic plan approved by the Committee.

### 13. Funding

- 13.1 The costs of hosting the Annual Meeting of Ministers Responsible for Local Government Meeting are paid by the host jurisdiction.
- 13.2 The Secretariat shall be funded by the members on a pro rata basis formula revised every five (5) years.

### 14. Final Provisions

- 14.1 The mandate of the Table of Ministers Responsible for Local Government is expected to evolve, as required, to ensure its maximum effectiveness on local government issues.
- 14.2 This agreement may be amended from time to time with the approval of all parties to this agreement.
- 14.3 This Agreement shall be reviewed every five (5) years following the year after this Agreement comes into effect.
- 14.4 This Organization must ensure the performance of its mandate in French and English at all times.
- 14.5 Nothing in this Agreement alters the legislative authority of the provincial or territorial legislatures or of the provincial or territorial governments or the rights of any of them with respect to the exercise of their legislative or other authorities under the Constitution of Canada.
- 14.6 Any member may withdraw from this Agreement by giving one year's notice in writing to the member who is the current Chair after having honoured all financial obligations for the current year and outstanding obligations from



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Lorne Kusugak Nunavut previous years, before the  $31^{st}$  of March in any year, the notice will take effect on the  $31^{st}$  March in the following year.

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### **Appendix 1: Definitions**

*Organization:* refers in the context of this agreement to all of the following tables together: the Table of Ministers, the Table of Deputy Ministers, the Provincial Territorial Officials Committee (PTOC) on Local Government and the Secretariat.

*Consensus Decision-making*: Implies that all participants may or may not agree with each specific aspect of the matter, consensus is reached if all participants are willing to come to a general agreement.

*Deputy Ministers:* refers to the deputy ministers responsible for Local Government of the ten Canadian provinces and three territories.

*Ministers:* means the ministers responsible for Local Government of the ten Canadian provinces and three territories.

*Provincial Territorial Officials Committee (PTOC) on Local Government (Committee):* refers to the committee of senior officials tasked to support the tables of ministers and deputy ministers. The Committee also acts as the Board of administrators of the Secretariat.
